Synopsis

Ten of the 28 lake trout sampled during the winter of 1991 were unclipped fish. Since the lake was stocked regularly prior to the 1991 winter creel (5600 fish since 1986), the 36% unclipped fish was considered significant. The relatively low catch rate of 0.08 fish/angler hour and extremely high harvest rate of 3.5 kg/ha indicated that harvest controls were required to sustain a balanced and healthy fish community. Based on the above considerations supplementary stocking was discontinued after 1991 and special regulations were imposed for lake trout fishing on Bella Lake commencing with the start of the 1996 fishing season.

Index netting was conducted in 2006. It was found that about 1/3 of the lake trout caught were stocked fish originating from neighbouring Rebecca Lake. Straying of stocked lake trout, particularly upstream is quite common.

Bella Lake is a 'fixed' lake for the provincial Broad-scale Monitoring program. It is one of the lakes randomly chosen to monitor the long term condition of lake trout lakes in FMZ 15. The first cycle of monitoring was done in 2011. Three previously undocumented fish species were detected: golden shiner, common shiner and bluntnose minnow. It is likely that all three species are native to the lake
