Synopsis

Elbow Lake is a small lake located just south-east of Graphite Lake in Butt Township. The 1977 lake survey stated that there were reports of lake trout being caught in the lake as well as rainbow trout being planted, although there is no factual evidence. The lake survey found no trout species in the lake. With a maximum depth of 5 meters there would not be enough cold water habitat for lake trout to survive.
