Synopsis

Martencamp Lake is a stocked brook trout lake located south of Tasso Lake in Finlayson Township. The lake is relatively deep for its size with a maximum depth of 17 meters. A brook trout assessment conducted in 1989 recorded a catch of one brook trout. Brook trout are currently stocked in the lake every two years as spring yearlings. The use of live bait fish is prohibited to try to reduce the chance of the inadvertent introduction of competitor species that would reduce the productivity of the brook trout population.
