Synopsis

North Dotty Lake is small and somewhat inaccessible due to private land; therefore the only work done on it has been the original lake surveys. Smallmouth bass were listed as being present in the 1953 report, but none were caught during netting in 1953 or 1972. It can only be assumed that they are present. The 'whitefish' mentioned in the 1965 report were found to be cisco in the 1972 survey. The lake has some deep water habitat and both brook and lake trout were stocked briefly in the past. The presence of bass and perch would limit brook trout survival and the moderate depth and presence of cisco would limit lake trout; combined with the questionable access there are no promising management options for this lake.
