Synopsis

In 1929, long before political correctness, Tooke Lake was listed as 'valueless'. This can probably be taken to mean that no major sport fish species were native to the lake. Smallmouth bass were stocked as early as 1939 and a self-sustaining population is now present. As it has been more than 40 years since any assessment has been done, it can only be assumed that bass continue to dominate the fish community
